

Eameses' lounge chair, inspired its name. This expansive piece of furniture allows a wide range of sitting and reclining positions and has long established itself as an icon of organic design.

Materials


- **Shell:** polyurethane, white lacquer finish.
- Base: chrome-plated tubular steel.
- Cruciform base: solid natural oak, protective natural lacquer finish.
- Origin of wood: oak (Quercus robur) from Western Europe and/or Poland.
