

He studied aerodynamics at the Sorbonne in Paris and completed his training in California before returning to Europe in 1968. He refers to his organic design language as biodesign. He has designed for many well-known manufacturers, like Fiat, Alfa Romeo, Lancia, VW, BMW and Kusch+Co. He always had close ties with the company and the Kusch family.




